Information on Nominations

Nominators Prize Draw

A prize draw for nominators will be held on the night. To be eligible you need to nominate an individual and must be at the awards function. If you are not present, there will be a redraw until the prize is claimed.

Nominations

Nominations for the CAFAWA Awards are not limited to people within your organisation, you can nominate any person from any area or organisation you wish. You are not restricted to one nomination. Please note nominations close 20th April 2022.

Please note: It is the nominators responsibility to ensure that nominees attend the awards evening.





Rising Star Award

(must have worked in the sector for less than 3 years)

Award Criteria

- The nominee has a 'can do' attitude and can demonstrate the positive outcomes and achievements in their work with children, young people and families.
- The nominee, through their role has made a significant positive impact on their organisation and/or the sector.
- The nominee shows promising potential and future goals on how they will continue to enrich the lives of children, families and communities through their work.



Collaboration and Working Together Award

Award Criteria

- The nominee's contributions to collaborative working across the sector have been significant and achieved positive outcomes.
- The nominee demonstrates inclusive practices, seeks out a diversity of voices eg, service users, government, key stakeholders and are respectful, sensitive and flexible in their approach.
- Provide evidence of positive feedback from stakeholders and the outcome of the collaboration.



Leadership Award

Award Criteria

- The nominee exhibits leadership qualities through their innovative, courageous and respectful ways of working.
- The nominee demonstrates the ability to lead and influence social policy, identify solutions and promote research and evidence-based practice that underpins good service design and delivery.
- The nominee builds and maintains strong, collaborative relationships with key stakeholders (e.g. Government, ACCOs, academia, sector peaks and community).



Embracing Culture Award

Award Criteria

- The nominee demonstrates the importance of culture to children, young people, families, and community wellbeing.
- The nominee demonstrates a commitment to listening, learning and being led by Aboriginal people, their communities and responds accordingly.
- The nominee ensures culture is central to practice, decision making and/or policy development.



Values Award

Award Criteria

- Integrity: The nominee works in an honest, transparent, and accountable manner that is representative of CAFAWA's values.
- Advocacy: The nominee amplifies the voices of those who access services and advocates for services that strengthen the wellbeing of children, young people, families and communities in WA.
- Leadership: The nominee is creative, courageous and respectful in finding solutions and advocating for social change.
